

68% view **Harris** as "too liberal to govern the country effectively"

70% view **Trump** as "too erratic and out of control to govern the country effectively"

By **55%-26%**, trust **Trump** more than **Harris** to "get inflation and the cost of living under control"





Senate: 51D-49R now, but brutal map for Democrats


